Simple account of Jesus' birth and why Jesus is important to Christians Decide what they personally have to be thankful for Recognise special places where people go to worship and what people do there. Identify objects of worship. Examples of how people worship in a church Think, talk and ask good questions about what happens in church. Talk about what makes some places special to people. Tell stories of Holy Week and Easter. Recognise that Jesus gives
